

Most of you don't like our plans to change the services.






Many of you are angry, sad and worried about the changes.

You felt the changes could make it harder for some people to keep living at home.



Day services





You told us you like seeing your friends and the staff at day services



Some of you are worried about being able to do activities you like.



Families are worried about staff leaving.



Some of you said you don't mind staying at home if you can't go to day services.



Community support service

You told us you are worried about:



- Being safe at home
- Being safe in the community



You said you need help to do jobs around the house.



You said you wouldn't be able to get out and about without the service.



You said it would make it harder to learn new things too.

Families told us it would be more stressful for them.




It would make it harder for them to have a break.

Because of what you told us we have changed some of our ideas:



If your day service changes AND how often you go to respite services, how much respite you get will stay the same till the end of March 2019.

If your day service AND your community support service changes, your community support hours will stay the same till the end of March 2019.



Our idea for an outreach respite service will not happen until April.




If your services will change you will be able to talk to a Care Manager about this before anything changes.

Respite Service



Longer respite breaks (for example one or two weeks) can still be taken as long as:





• Breaks start on either a Monday or a Friday



Breaks end on either a Friday or a Monday

Day Services

The day each day service would close has changed to make sure that respite breaks are not affected.

The closure days are now proposed as follows:



Linden Court



Linden Court, Eastbourne to close on a Tuesday.







Hookstead

Monday
Tuesday
Wednesday
Thursday
Friday

Hastings and Rother day service and Hookstead, Crowborough to close on a Wednesday.



St. Nicholas Centre



St. Nicholas Centre, Lewes to close on a Thursday.





On 26 June there will be a meeting at East Sussex County Council to talk about all the ideas for saving money and to make some decisions.





Councillors will read what you have told us to help them to decide what to do.



The Council has to save a lot of money. It's nearly £10 million for social care.



The decisions are difficult and may make things worse for people.



But, we will still provide services for people who need it, and we take that job very seriously.
