THE EAST SUSSEX (ARTHUR ROAD TO DOWN ROAD, BEXHILL) CYCLE TRACKS ORDER 2025

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT East Sussex County Council made the above Order on 12 September 2025. The effects of the Order are to convert the following footpaths into shared-use cycle tracks (permitted use for pedal cycles and pedestrians);

- 1. Footpath Bexhill 140 from its junction with Arthur Road (adjacent to Bexhill Amateur Athletics Sports Centre) to Footpath Bexhill 116 a distance of 11 metres.
- **2. Footpath Bexhill 116b** from its junction with Footpath Bexhill 140 to its junction with Footpath Bexhill 141 a distance of 36 metres.
- 3. Footpath Bexhill 141 from its junction with Footpath Bexhill 116b to its junction with Little Common Road a distance of 29 metres.
- **4. Footpath Bexhill 142** from its junction with Little Common Road (adjacent to Bexhill Amateur Athletics Sports Centre) to its junction with Down Road (adjacent to King Offa Academy) a distance of 35 metres.

This Order will not come into force until it is confirmed.
