**The East Sussex (Rother District)(Parking Places, Waiting, No Stopping and
Loading Restrictions) Traffic Regulation Order 2020
Experimental Traffic Regulation Order 2022
(Camber Road & New Lydd Road, Camber)**

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The County Council's reasons for making the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order are:

The introduction of No Waiting At Any Time restrictions in Camber will alleviate congestion and maintain traffic flow on Camber Road & New Lydd Road to allow emergency vehicles to pass through without issue during, but not limited to, days with significant visitor numbers and to preserve and improve the amenity of the area.

The Experimental Traffic Regulation Order will enable the County Council to monitor the operation of the No Waiting At Any Time restriction, to assess if they are working effectively and that restricting the use of the grass verges for parking by vehicles does not adversely affect road safety. The Council would make appropriate modifications if required.

If it is considered successful, the County Council would make the experimental Order permanent (subject to any objections being received during the initial 6 month consultation period, or any subsequent 6 month consultation period) within a maximum period of 18 months.
