

Permits

Resident Permits

Residents living in the Bexhill permit zones can buy up to two permits that allow parking in the zone where they live.

Residents living in the proposed Rye permit zone C can buy one permit that allows parking in the zone where they live. Second permits will become available following the initial uptake if there is enough available kerb space.

Permit holders can park in shared use, permit holder or resident permit holder bays without time limit in the specific zone for which the permit is issue

A permit will not be issued if:

- the vehicle exceeds 3.2 metres overall height, 6.5 metres overall length and 5 tonnes gross weight
- there is one or more PCN issued to the vehicle registered as a debt
- the property is in a private road.

Resident Visitor Permits (except Rye)

Each household can buy up to 100 visitor permits each year (house bound residents can buy up to 150 permits).

Resident visitor permits cost 50p each and can be bought individually or in books of ten. If you are a house bound resident you will be able to purchase visitor permits at a reduced cost of 25p. Permits are not transferable, exchangeable or refundable.

Permits will not be issued:

- for any vehicle that exceeds 3.2 metres overall height, 6.5 metres overall length and 5 tonnes gross weight
- if you have one or more PCN registered as a debt.

Business Permits (except Rye)

Businesses within the permit zones can buy up to six permits that allow parking either in a single zone or throughout the permit zones for up to three vehicles. Permits are assigned to the vehicle registration numbers and cannot be transferred.

A permit will only be issued if:

- the business address is within the permit zones, and
- the vehicle is essential for the running of the organisation.

Permits should only be used to assist with the efficient operation of the business, such as when making deliveries or undertaking site visits, and should not be used for any other purpose such as personal business or long term parking.

There are various other permits available to specific service users, permits can be issued upon request dependent on the applicant meeting the required criteria.
